



Assiut University Learning Outcomes for 2023

In the academic year 2022/2023, a total of 19,506 students graduated from Assiut University across all faculties. Among them, 7,092 were graduates from the Faculty of Education (teachers), and 3,065 were Basic Education teachers. The Adult Education Center at the Faculty of Education eradicated illiteracy for 5,576 individuals in Assiut Governorate, with 3,741 in 2023 and 1,835 in 2022.

The Faculty of Education, the Faculty of Specific Education, the Faculty of Early Childhood Education, and the Faculty of Physical Education trained 7,250 student-teachers in 253 different schools across Assiut Governorate, with a total of 6,320 students from these schools in attendance. A total of 310 faculty members from the mentioned faculties supervised the training.

As regard **International Computer Driving License (ICDL) training**, the university's Information Network Center trained 78 groups, totaling 3,201 participants, including students, faculty members, graduates, employees, and international students. The center conducted 17,350 ICDL exams within the Information Network Center. Additionally, the center held 60 digital transformation courses, with 1,850 individuals taking exams.

The **University Education Development Center** held 38 training courses, including courses to prepare the university for accreditation, credit hours courses, training on using educational platforms, e-learning, learning management systems, English language courses, and courses on IC3 and digital transformation. These courses targeted the university's faculty members, graduates, and students (4773).

The **English Language Center** at the university conducted 147 training sessions for students, graduates, and faculty members, with a total of 7,779 participants. It also held 979 placement tests for all targeted groups.



Similarly, the **French Language Center** at the university held 33 training groups covering different levels of the French language, from level one to four, as well as phonetics courses for 885 students, graduates, and international students. The German Language Center also organized training sessions, conducting six groups for levels one to three and translation courses, with 280 students, graduates, and international students participating.

The **Public Service Center at the Faculty of Education** conducted 37 educational courses, including teaching mathematics and science in English, various levels of English language courses, Arabic language courses for non-native speakers, and SPSS statistical analysis courses, benefiting a total of 532 students.

Additionally, the **university's Measurement and Evaluation Center** organized 25 various courses for 290 faculty members and their assistants. These courses covered topics such as report writing, electronic grading, training certified trainers, content analysis, preparing specification tables, advanced SPSS, automated grading, building researchers' electronic identity, presenting for international publication, professional report writing, and the fundamentals and ethics of assessment.

Similarly, the **Biological Research Center** conducted 10 workshops for 102 students and faculty members.

The **University's Anti-Violence Unit** organized 38 events and activities for university students, school pupils, and a group of children with special needs, with a total of 145 participants.

The **Faculty of Social Work** organized 32 seminars and workshops for 1,100 individuals from various sectors of society, including students and graduates.



The Faculty of Agriculture held 22 workshops and courses, targeting 540 students and graduates from the faculty.

The University's Career Development Center organized 18 training courses on employment skills, marketing, human resources, project management, and occupational health and safety, with a total of 380 participants.

The Student Disability Support Center held 33 activities, workshops, courses, and initiatives, covering topics such as human development, English language, digital transformation, disability rights awareness, empowerment, accessibility, and sign language courses, with a total of 848 attendees.

The General Administration of Libraries held four workshops for employees on digital transformation and automated cataloging, with a total of 142 participants.

The Psychological and Educational Counseling Center held 15 workshops on topics such as speech therapy, speech disorders, autism spectrum disorder, behavior modification, comprehensive early childhood development, learning difficulties, and sign language, with a total of 412 trainees.

The Faculty Development Center conducted 552 courses on topics such as organizing scientific conferences, digital transformation, crisis management, research ethics, academic leadership programs, and analytical and creative thinking in teaching, with a total of 8,180 participants.

The Technology Services Unit organized 22 courses for faculty members and their assistants, covering topics such as using the Knowledge Bank, training assistants to create tests and assignments on Microsoft platforms, and searching on Google Scholar, with a total of 202 participants.



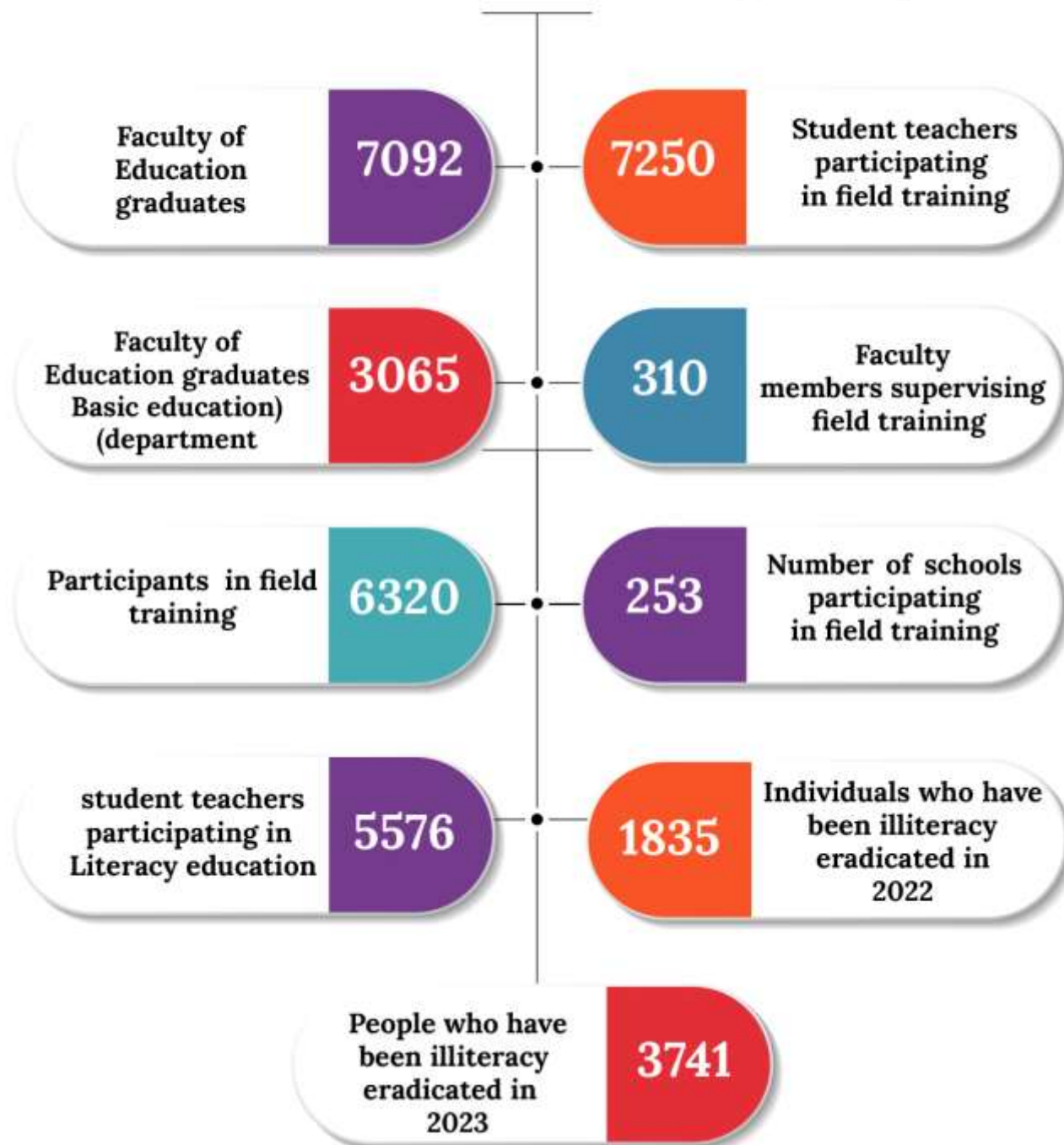
The Human Rights Center conducted 29 courses and workshops on various topics, including handling physical abuse, harassment, and the rights of women and children, reaching a total of 3,135 participants.

University hospitals organized 35 seminars on various health topics, awareness, and infection control.

The university administration had held 60 conferences, 50 seminars, and 85 workshops in various scientific fields, including medicine, pharmacy, engineering, education, arts, agriculture, social sciences, veterinary science, literature, commerce, and law, benefiting a total of 8,140 participants.
