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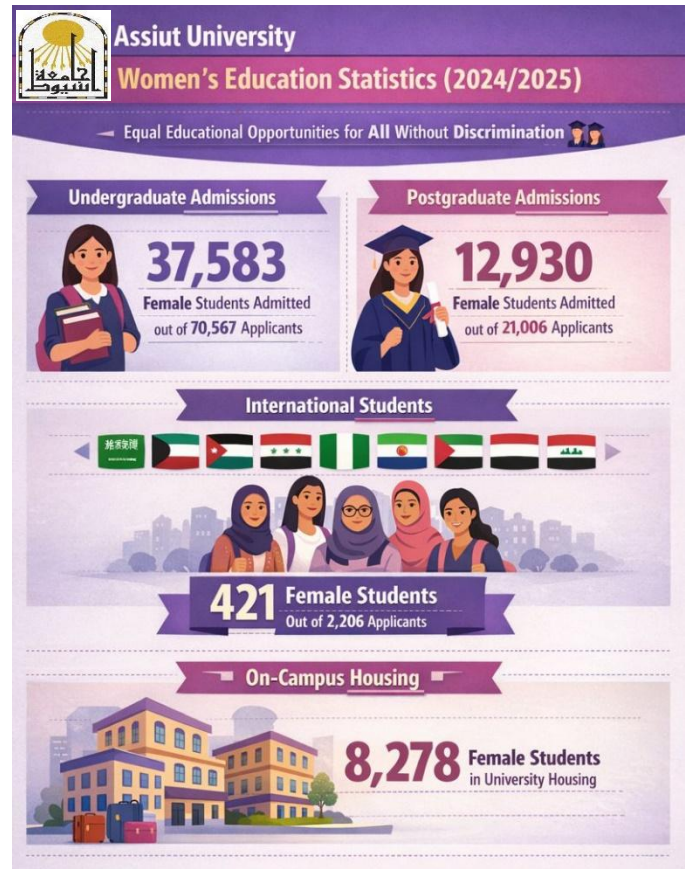

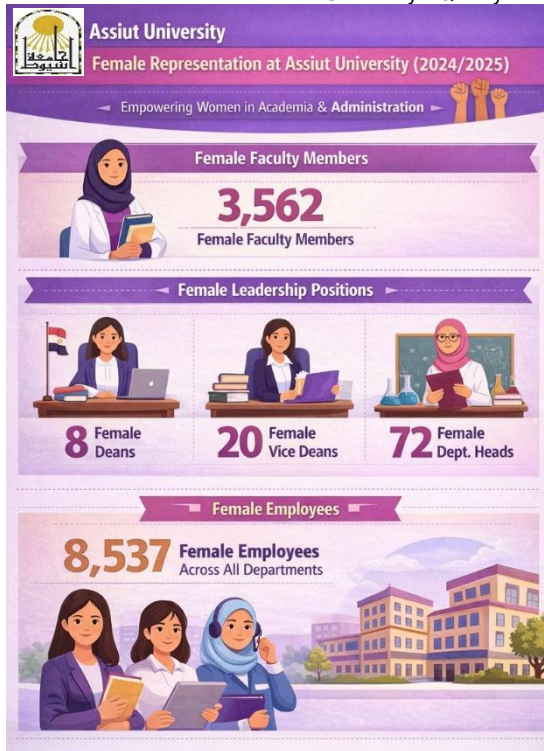
Final Report (2024)

- **Assiut University supports women's education** in accordance with the regulations of the Supreme Council of Universities and upholds the principle of equal educational opportunities for all, males and females, without discrimination, at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

It also provided them with university accommodation in the vicinity of the campus for those whose residence is about 40 km away from the university for new students, and for those whose residence is more than 70 km away for students in higher years.



- In the 2024/2025 academic year, 37,583 female students were admitted to undergraduate programs across all university faculties, out of a total of 70,567 applicants, and 12,930 female students were admitted to postgraduate programs, out of a total of 21,006 applicants. Among the international students, 421 were female undergraduate students, out of a total of 2,206 applicants, from Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Jordan, Palestine, Syria, Yemen, Nigeria, Sudan, India, and Iraq..
- The number of female students benefiting from on-campus housing in the 2024/2025 academic year reached 8,278.

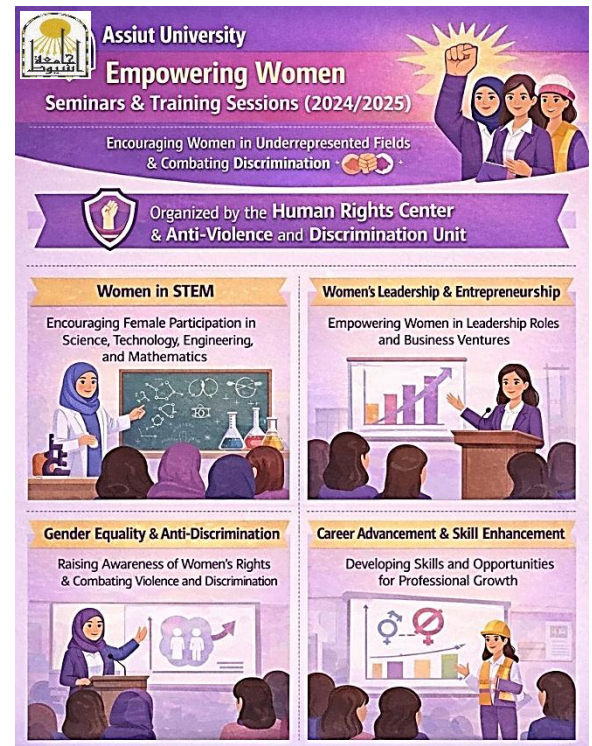


- There are a number of female faculty members at the university. In the academic year, the total number of female faculty members reached 3,562. Women are also represented at Assiut University in many administrative positions. In 2024/2025, there were 8 female deans, 20 female vice deans, and 72 female department heads across the university's various colleges.

- Additionally, approximately 8,537

female employees work at the university across all its departments and administrations.

- During the 2024/2025 academic year, Assiut University held several seminars and training sessions to encourage women in areas where they are underrepresented, and to combat discrimination against women, through the Human Rights Center's Anti-Violence and Discrimination Unit.





- **Assiut University is committed to implementing the Civil Service Law** and regulations to support working women. These rights include paid maternity leave (4 months) up to three times, childcare leave, reduced working hours for pregnant women starting from the sixth month, and spousal leave.

In the 2024/2025 academic year, 207 woman was granted maternity leave and 70 woman was granted spousal leave.

- **The university has several nurseries where female students, staff, and faculty members can leave their children while they are working or studying.** These include the nursery at the College of Early Childhood Education, the nursery at the university hospital, and the Al-Rahma Nursery for Children with Special Needs, which is affiliated with the Women's Association.

During the 2024/2025 academic year, a number of children enrolled in the nursery at the College of Early Childhood Education.
