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Definition

Characteristics of the Board of Directors of the Unit

- Receiving student reports and solving problems or submitting them to the Dean of the College or the Vice Dean for Education and Student Affairs.
- Organizing guidance and orientation meetings, courses and workshops organizing the mentoring process.

What is an academic advisor?

It is a member of staff of the college who is responsible for academic guidance for a group of undergraduate students and follows the students' scientific career from entering the college until he graduates from it and extends a helping hand to them to solve their scientific and social problems until he achieves success in his university life

- It is characterized by sincerity.
- Avoid establishing personal relationships with students.
- To keep students' secrets and privacy

Tasks of the academic advisor

- Follow up wih the student from the moment he enters the college
- . Monitor the student's academic progress.
- Provide advice and guidance to the student.
- Encourage the student to participate in student work and activities.
- Reviewing university instructions for students
- Encourage excellent students to maintain that level.
